Note: Parade will be held indoors at Cornwall Town Hall if it rains!

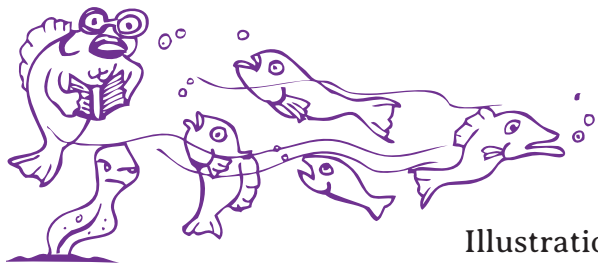
5:30-6:30 | *Potluck Dinner at Cornwall Town Hall*, (please RSVP & bring a dish, if you will be attending!)
